Your pet is being admitted for a dental cleaning and/or extractions. A general anesthetic is required. This allows the doctor to give a more extensive oral examination. Occasionally, we may find diseased teeth or gums that were not obvious in the initial exam and additional dental procedures would be in the best interest of your pet's health. Pain Medication and antibiotics may be given to your pet as needed. **Additional work and medications will be charged accordingly.**

Pain Medication and/or antibiotics will be given to your pet prior to surgery if indicated. This charge is additional and is based on the weight of your pet. Additional medication will also be sent home if it is needed.

Elizabethan Collar: If your animal begins licking or biting at the surgical site, we will place an E-collar on the pet to prevent damage to the area.
