Pain Medication and antibiotics may be given to your pet as needed. **Additional work and medications will be charged accordingly.**

Elizabethan Collar: If your animal begins licking or biting at the surgical site, we will place an E-collar on the pet to prevent damage to the area.

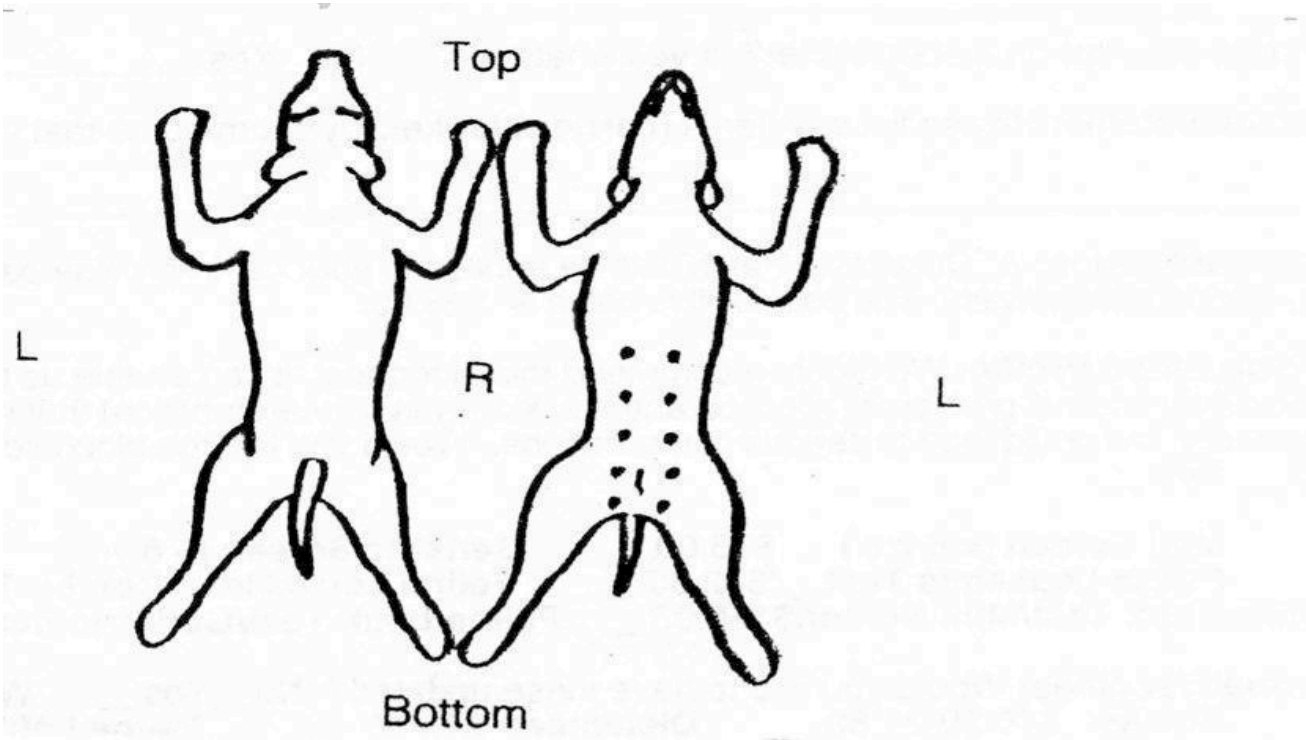
